# The Gathering Community Group Guide Moving Day // Part 3 // Are we there yet?

Community Groups are used extensively as the primary vehicle for discipleship at The Gathering and run on a quarter system. There is one in the fall, one in the winter and one in the spring. During the summer weeks we don't meet in Community Groups but we still offer the Growth Guides as a tool to help you grow personally. The Growth Guides are designed to help you dig deeper into the weekly sermon on your own or with your family and are available each week along with the note sheets at church as well as online.

### Consider...

Use the summary and discussion below to review and apply this week's message:

#### Message Summary

Most moves in life eventually come to an end, right? Rooms get painted, boxes get unpacked and life begins to return to normal. Translation? We move, and then we settle. But if moving is God's plan to keep us from settling, then we're always going to be on the move, because we can't afford to settle HERE if our ultimate home is THERE (see Hebrews 13:14). And that means that we often ask God the same 4 words that kids ask parents every time they go on a trip..."are we there yet?" In the final week of "Moving Day," Paul reveals 3 reasons kids (and believers) ask that question:

- 1. **We're excited about the destination:** Ultimately, our destination is heaven in the presence of God, but it's also PEOPLE who will be in the presence of God with us, and the picture of that is in Rev. 5:9-10. There we find a beautiful mosaic of people from every nation, tribe and tongue in ONE PLACE with ONE VOICE worshiping ONE KING. That's a destination that should excite us!
- 2. **We're tired of the journey:** Like all kids on a road trip, the excitement about the destination eventually wears off and gets replaced by the weariness of being in a car with the same people for a long time! Remember YOUR dad yelling, "Don't make me pull the car over!" It's natural to get tired OF the journey, but the Holy Spirit can give us supernatural power ON the journey!
- 3. **We've forgotten about the arrival:** It can become so easy to lose hope on a long road trip! We start to think we'll never get there, and we forget about the arrival. The excited "are we there yet?" becomes an excruciating "are we there yet?" Many people asked God "how long?" throughout the Bible, and a big part of not forgetting about the arrival is remembering how far we've come.

#### **Discuss**

Use the following questions to review and apply the points learned in the message.

- What takeaway if any did you have from the message this week?
- Discuss the differences between appreciating things in this life and becoming attached to things in this life. What light does 1 John 2:15-17 shed on the discussion?
- Read Revelation 5:9-10. Share what that would look like here on earth, and specifically, here at The Gathering. What emotions do you feel as you talk?
- What does Ephesians 4:3 say is necessary for us to have unity (and by unity, I mean "not kill each other in the car on the way to heaven!")? In light of John 13:34-35, why do you think the way we travel together is such a big deal?
- There are 59 "One Another" verses in the New Testament (I've attached them to this guide). How can these "travel tips" help us along the way?
- Paul said in the message that part of not forgetting about the arrival is remembering how far we've come. In 1 Samuel 7:14, it was a rock with the word "Ebenezer" written on it. For David, it was remembering how good God had been to him (Psalm 13:6). What about you? What are some of your Ebenezer moments? How has God been good and faithful to this point in your journey?
